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### Acute Pain Management Operative Or

The Acute Pain Management Guideline Panel recommends that any hospital in which abdominal or thoracic operations are routinely performed offer patients postoperative regional anesthetic, epidural or intrathecal opioids, PCA infusions, and other interventions requiring a similar level of expertise, under the supervision of an acute pain service as described in summary recommendation 6.

Pain Following Surgery May Vary Quite Widely in Severity. Postsurgical undertreatment of pain has been linked to reduced quality of life, surgical complications, prolonged rehabilitation, and development of chronic pain. Thus, in certain situations, the benefits of a limited course of opioids may outweigh the risks if pain management is inadequate with nonopioid therapies.

Gabapentinoids, a class of drugs including gabapentin and pregabalin, were originally marketed in the 1990s for use as anticonvulsants and subsequently approved to treat specific chronic neuropathic pain conditions. 1-5 Over the last decade, the off-label use of gabapentinoids for the control of acute nociceptive or neuropathic pain has drastically increased in several countries, 6-8 and they are now routinely used for the management of postoperative analgesia to decrease pain and opioid ...

Inadequate post-operative pain control can lead to poor recovery, function, and quality of life and can increase the risk of persistent post-surgical pain and complications. 1 With over 80% of surgical patients experiencing acute post-operative pain and approximately 75% of those with post-operative pain reporting the severity as moderate or higher, 2,3 It is important to achieve adequate pain control to minimize suffering, improve patient satisfaction, promote early post-surgical ...

Traditionally, acute perioperative pain management has relied solely on opioid medications to target central mechanisms involved in the perception of pain (figure 4). A better approach uses several agents, each acting at different sites of the pain pathway, and is known as multimodal analgesia.

SUMMARY. Postoperative pain management aims to minimise patient discomfort, facilitate early mobilisation and functional recovery, and prevent acute pain developing into chronic pain. Mental health can affect a patient's recovery and psychological vulnerability is predictive of severe postoperative pain. Education before surgery reduces anxiety and improves patient satisfaction.

### Guidelines on the Management of Postoperative Pain

Inadequate management of acute pain negatively impacts numerous aspects of patient health, and may increase the risk of developing chronic pain. Although opioids are the preferred treatment for most moderate to severe acute pain, their side effects can impede their use, and thus, their clinical effectiveness.

### Causes and Consequences of Inadequate Management of Acute Pain

Background: Multimodal analgesia; a combination of opioid and non-opioid analgesics, for management of acute post-operative pain significantly reduces the incidence of adverse effects associated with liberal post-operative opioid use including sedation, respiratory depression, constipation, ileus, urinary retention, delayed recovery, addiction etc.

### Opioid-free Analgesia for the Management of Acute Post ...

Acute pain is provoked by identifiable stimuli and disappears as soon as the tissue injury or damage that had caused it is healed. Postoperative pain is a typical example of acute pain. All surgical procedures are asso- ciated with a certain level of postoperative pain.

If upon discontinuation of PNC or epidural it is determined the patient needs further specialized management by either Acute Pain Medicine or primary team, consider consulting Chronic Pain Management C. If at any time a post-operative patient has uncontrolled pain issues for more than 24 hours, consider consulting Chronic Pain Management D.
